# 1. Answer: B

# 3. Answer: B

**Incorrect Options:**

- d) The passage does not mention that Marathas were historically aligned with the Janata Dal.

# Answer: B

**Explanation:** The passage mentions that Eknath Shinde announced the inclusion of Marathas in the OBC category (line 13).

Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not mention that Marathas are excluded from the OBC category.
- c) The passage does not mention that Marathas are forming a new political party.
- d) The passage does not mention that Marathas are joining hands with the Congress.

# 5. Answer: C

**Explanation:** The passage mentions that Eknath Shinde, initially perceived as a mere pawn, soon realized the importance of having his own vote base (lines 30-31). Incorrect Options:

# 6. Answer: A

**Explanation:** The passage states that the children felt stifled inside the curtained and shuttered house and strained to get out, feeling like their lungs were stuffed, and they wanted to see the sun and feel the air (lines 6-8).

Incorrect Options:

d) The passage mentions that the children wanted to escape the house to see the sun, so they did not want to avoid the bright sunlight.

#### 7. Answer: C

**Explanation:** The passage mentions that the mother would not open the door initially, but she eventually lets down the bolt of the front door after the children wail and beg (lines 10-11, 14-15). Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not mention that the mother opens the door immediately.
- b) The passage does not mention any scolding by the mother.
- d) The passage mentions that the mother eventually opens the door, so she does not ignore their request.

### 8. Answer: B

**Explanation:** The passage describes the afternoon as too hot and too bright, with glaring white walls and a garden that resembles a tray made of beaten brass (lines 17-19). Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not describe the afternoon as pleasant and cool.
- c) The passage does not mention that it was cloudy and overcast.
- d) The passage does not mention that it was windy and stormy.

#### Answer: C

**Explanation:** The passage describes the outdoor dog as lying stretched out, attempting to lift his tail in a wag but failing, rolling his eyes, and appearing as if dead (lines 23-26). Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not mention that the dog is actively playing with the children.
- b) The passage does not suggest that the dog is lying comfortably.
- d) The passage does not mention that the dog is chasing squirrels in the garden.

### 10. Answer: B

**Explanation:** The passage mentions that the children, after being released, began tumbling and shoving, frantic to start the business of the children's day, which is play (lines 34-35). Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not mention homework and studies as the main business of the children's day.
- c) The passage does not suggest that chores and responsibilities are the main business of the children's day.
- d) While indoor games are mentioned, the main emphasis is on outdoor play, which is the correct answer.

# Answer: D

**Explanation:** The passage states that on Sunday, England humbled India, and the West Indies humbled Australia, indicating that England lost, and the West Indies won (lines 2-3). Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not mention that England won their match.
- b) The passage does not mention that both England and the West Indies lost.
- c) The passage does not mention that the West Indies lost.

### 12. Answer: B

**Explanation:** The passage mentions Ollie Pope's splendid 196 in the second innings against India (lines 15-16).

Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not mention that Ollie Pope took wickets.
- c) While England led 1-0 in the series, it is not mentioned as Ollie Pope's achievement.
- d) The passage does not mention that Ollie Pope made a comeback.

# 13. **Answer:** B

**Explanation:** The passage mentions Virat Kohli's absence due to personal reasons, indicating that it left a vacuum in the middle order (lines 20-21).



**Incorrect Options:** 

- a) The passage does not suggest that the mention of Virat Kohli's absence is to highlight England's advantage.
- c) The passage does not suggest that England deliberately targeted Kohli.
- d) The passage does not state that the mention of Kohli is to showcase India's strong middle order.

### 14. Answer: D

**Explanation:** The passage mentions that Test cricket found its mojo, reiterated its durability, and has the potential to alter scripts and presumptions (lines 1-2, 4-5).

Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage does not suggest that Test cricket is overshadowed by ODIs and T20Is.

- c) The passage does not indicate that Test cricket is losing its popularity.

### 15. Answer: B

### 16. Answer: A

**Incorrect Options:**

# 17. Answer: C

### 18. Answer: C

Incorrect Options:

- d) The passage contradicts the idea that the father did not express any opinion on the protagonist's choices.

### 19. Answer: D

**Explanation:** The passage mentions the father's view that adventures abroad were for men of desperate fortunes or aspiring, superior fortunes (lines 22-24).

Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage contradicts the idea that the father believed the protagonist was not adventurous enough.

c) The passage does not mention that the father considered foreign countries to be unsuitable for the protagonist.

#### 20. Answer: B

Incorrect Options:

- a) The passage contradicts the idea that his father's influence led to his head being filled with rambling thoughts.
- c) The passage does not suggest that lack of education filled his head with rambling thoughts.
- d) The passage does not suggest that a desire for wealth filled his head with rambling thoughts.

### 21. Answer: B

Incorrect Options:

- d) Although gender disparity is mentioned, it is not the central theme as per the passage.

# 22. Answer: A

**Incorrect Options:**

# 23. Answer: C

### 24. Answer: B

India contains nearly 27,000 Ramsar Sites out of which there are 23000 inland Ramsar Sites and around 4000 coastal Ramsar Sites

#### 33. Answer: D

# 39. Answer: C

**Explanation:** Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi today, in Kavaratti, Lakshadweep, inaugurated Kochi-Lakshadweep islands submarine optical fiber connection (KLI-SOFC) project among various developmental projects worth more than Rs 1,150 crore covering a wide range of sectors including technology, energy, water resources, healthcare and education.



- The need for digitally connecting the Lakshadweep Islands through a high capacity submarine cable
  link with the main land has been felt for some time. Earlier, the only means of communication with the
  Islands was through Satellite medium, which had limited bandwidth capacity and was not able to meet
  the growing bandwidth demand.
- The Department of Telecommunications (DOT) took immediate action and conceptualized the Kochi-Lakshadweep Submarine OFC Project (KLI project). The KLI project has been completed well within the timelines.
- In the Kochi-Lakshadweep Islands Submarine Cable (KLI) project submarine cable connectivity from Mainland (Kochi) to eleven Lakshadweep Islands namely, Kavaratti, Agatti, Amini, Kadmat, Chetlet, Kalpeni, Minicoy, Androth, Kiltan, Bangaram and Bitra has been extended.
- The project is funded by Universal Services Obligation Fund (USOF), Department of Telecommunication.
- Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) was the Project Executing Agency and the work was awarded
  to M/s NEC Corporation India Pvt Ltd through Global Open Tendering process. Major activities related
  to the project includes Marine Route Survey, Submarine Cable laying, Civil Construction of CLS
  stations, Installation, Testing and Commissioning of End Terminals (SLTE).

#### 40. Answer: D

**Explanation:** The Agreement on the Prohibition of Attack against Nuclear Installations and Facilities was signed on 31st December, 1988, by the then Pakistani Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto and Indian PM Rajiv Gandhi.

#### 41. Answer: C

The agreement mandates both countries to inform each other about any nuclear installations and facilities to be covered under the agreement on the 1st of January of every calendar year, providing a confidence-building security measure environment.

### 42. Answer: B

**Explanation:** Restrictive trade policies and high tariffs imposed by both countries hinder cross-border trade and economic connectivity.

In August 2019, Pakistan halted trade with India in response to constitutional amendments made in the Jammu and Kashmir region.

India imposed a 200% tariff on Pakistani imports in 2019, when Pakistan's Most Favored Nation (MFN) designation was removed in the aftermath of the Pulwama terrorist incident.

# 43. Answer: D

**Explanation:** The Agreement on the Prohibition of Attack against Nuclear Installations and Facilities was signed on 31st December, 1988, by the then Pakistani Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto and Indian PM Rajiv Gandhi.

The treaty came into force on 27th January, 1991.

The recent one is the 33rd consecutive exchange of such lists between the two countries, the first one having taken place on 01st January, 1992.

# 44. Answer: C

**Explanation:** The 60th TOP500 was published in November 2022. Since June 2022, the United States' Frontier is the most powerful supercomputer on TOP500, reaching 1102 petaFlops (1.102 exaFlops) on the LINPACK benchmarks. The 500 fastest supercomputers are spread across 35 countries, of which 29 countries have more than one system. From November 2017 until November 2022, China had the highest number of supercomputers.

But as of June 2023, the US has resumed the top position on the Top500 list, and the number has since increased from 150 supercomputers to 161 in November. China has 104 and is followed by Germany,



which has 36 supercomputers. Japan and France round out the top five, with the UK, Canada, Italy, South Korea, the Netherlands and Canada completing the top 10.

### 45. Answer: D

**Explanation:** Some of the countries taking part in building the SKA include the UK, Australia, South Africa, Canada, China, France, India, Italy and Germany. India, through the Pune-based National Centre for Radio Astrophysics (NCRA) and other institutions, has played a key role in the development of the ambitious SKAO project since its inception in the 1990s.

India's primary contribution to SKAO lies in the development and operation of the Telescope Manager element, essentially the "neural network" or software that controls the entire telescope's operation.

NCRA is a research institution in India that specializes in radio astronomy. It is located on the Pune University Campus and is part of the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR) in Mumbai.

### 46. Answer: C

**Explanation:** Gravitational wave research, as evidenced by the 2017 Nobel Prize awarded for the first detection using Laser Interferometer Gravitational Wave Observatory (LIGO), holds immense potential for scientific breakthroughs.

LIGO is the largest and most ambitious project ever funded by the NSF. In 2017, the Nobel Prize in Physics was awarded to Rainer Weiss, Kip Thorne and Barry C. Barish "for decisive contributions to the LIGO detector and the observation of gravitational waves".

Recently, India gave its go-ahead to construct the third node of the LIGO in Hingoli district of Maharashtra. Gravitational waves are ripples or vibrations in the very fabric of spacetime. For instance, when a pebble is dropped in a pond, the resulting ripples are analogous to gravitational waves, but instead of water, they propagate through the fundamental structure of the universe.

In 1916, Albert Einstein forecasted the presence of gravitational waves within his theory of general relativity.

### 47. Answer: B

**Explanation:** Countries have to sign, and ratify, the SKAO convention to formally become members. The Government of India's approval for joining the project, with a financial sanction of Rs 1,250 crore, is the first step towards the ratification. India will also be part of the world's largest radio telescope project called the Square Kilometre Array Observatory (SKAO).

The project will not have a single telescope but an array of thousands of antennas, to be installed in remote radio-quiet locations in South Africa and Australia, that will operate as one large unit meant to observe and study celestial phenomena.

SKAO objectives also include study of gravitational waves.

# 48. Answer: D

**Explanation:** It is expected to become operational by 2029.

### 49. Answer: B

**Explanation:** Although the idea of a legal aid programme was earlier floated in the 1950s, it was in 1980 that a committee at the national level was established under the chairmanship of then SC judge Justice PN Bhagwati. The Committee for Implementing Legal Aid Schemes started monitoring legal aid activities throughout India.District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs) and Taluk Legal Services Committees were established in districts and most taluks. Situated in the District Courts Complex in every district, each DLSA is chaired by the District Judge of the respective district.

The Taluka or Sub-Divisional Legal Services Committees are headed by a senior civil judge. Collectively, these bodies organise legal awareness camps, provide free legal services, and supply and obtain certified order copies and other legal documents, among other functions.

# 50. Answer: D

**Explanation:** Supreme Court judge Justice BR Gavai has been nominated as the Chairman of the Supreme Court Legal Services Committee (SCLSC), replacing Justice Sanjiv Khanna – the seniormost judge of the top court after the Chief Justice of India (CJI).



A notification issued by the Department of Justice on December 29, 2023, announced Justice Gavai's nomination. Here is what the committee is, and what the law says on legal services in India. As of date, the SCLSC consists of chairperson BR Gavai and nine members nominated by the CJI. The Committee, in turn, can appoint officers and other employees as prescribed by the Centre, in consultation with the CJI.

### 51. Answer: A

**Explanation:** The need for providing legal services has been underlined in many provisions of the Indian Constitution. Article 39A states, the State shall secure that the operation of the legal system promotes justice, on a basis of equal opportunity, and shall, in particular, provide free legal aid, by suitable legislation or schemes or in any other way, to ensure that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities.

### 52. Answer: D

**Explanation:** Under the Act, NALSA was constituted in 1995 to monitor and evaluate the implementation of legal aid programmes and to lay down policies for making legal services available.

A nationwide network has been envisaged under the Act for providing legal aid and assistance.

It also disburses funds and grants to State Legal Services Authorities and NGOs for implementing legal aid schemes and programmes.

Note- NALSA v. Union of India, is a very important judgment recognizing rights of transgenders (as a third gender) in India.



# Legal Reasoning

#### 53. Answer: D

**Explanation:** Option D is correct as the initiation of proceedings or forming the committee is the next step in the removal process, not the direct removal. Moreover, there is an ambiguity as to which house initiated it. Furthermore, investigation has to be done by the committee. Option A is incorrect as it does not align with the legal process described in the passage. A judge can be removed by an order of the President, based on a motion passed by both houses of Parliament with the assent of the President after the committee finds the judge guilty of the charges. If the motion is adopted by the required majority, the judge is slated to be removed. Option B is incorrect. The legal process described focuses on the parliamentary motion for removal rather than criminal charges. Criminal charges are not covered here. Option C is incorrect for the same reasoning as Option A, with the only difference being the assent of the President, which is necessary for removal.

# 54. Answer: A

**Explanation:** Option A is indeed correct, as it aligns with the legal process outlined in the passage. The fact that Mr. Sandhi has at least 65 members of the Rajya Sabha allows for the formation of a committee, as stated in the passage. Option B is incorrect because the formation of a committee is considered a course of action. Option C is incorrect because the President's involvement occurs after the motion has been adopted by both houses of Parliament, and the President does not appoint any committee. Option D is also incorrect because the removal of Justice Palaswamy requires a valid motion, which is lacking in this scenario.

#### 55. Answer: B

**Explanation:** Option B is correct because Mr. Sandhi only has 65 members of the Lok Sabha, which is less than the required minimum of at least 100 members to give a signed notice to the chairman. Option A is incorrect because of the same reason as option B i.e., insufficient MPs. Option C is incorrect.
